CEO MESSAGE

If there was one underlying message to you this term, it is that we are exited for our concert *Moving Through Time*. Whilst this year's theme symbolises music and movement through the ages, for me what is most powerful is the emotion-charged experience we all

have seeing participants shine on stage, seeing them grow over time, form friendships and develop in confidence. It's about the participants and more broadly about our families, volunteers and the community we have created.

Some of the personal stories that anchor our cause create strength in our community and give reason to work through some of the challenges our small and predominately volunteer driven organisation faces.

Whilst we strive to advance our impact and to reach more people with Down syndrome (currently we service 1% of the Down syndrome population in Australia) and their families, equally we are working hard to continue to offer reduced cost services for people with Down syndrome. Currently less than 20% of class fees cover program delivery costs. The 80% funding gap is currently met through philanthropic grants, private donations and fundraising efforts. Every story you share, contact made and our performances advocate for you and in turn advocate the work of e.motion21. We need to be united in our efforts for larger impact.

In August we will be surveying you to get your feedback on our programs, to learn the lessons we need for future progress.

As we are in the final stages of rehearsals for the annual concert, we would appreciate your full attendance in class. The participants depend on each other's attendance for the choreography and learning.

Sadly, we have closed our Highett site as we have been unable to find a suitably qualified replacement teacher for the start of the term, however the good news is all participants will be transferring to alternative sites (Cranbourne and Rowville).

There will no doubt be numerous highlights this term but what better way to kick off the term with the birth of long term teacher, colleague and friend Anna Booth's (and Ricky) baby boy (as pictured below). Can't wait to see you all also at the screening of our award winning documentary Raising The Bar!
